

Pool and backyard goals

Overall design

- · Optimize space, consider function & form, design elements and flow between areas
- · Maintain grass areas for pets
- · Maintain farm view
- · Design for safety, security, and energy efficiency
- Enhance backyard privacy

Materials

- · Use maintenance free, minimal upkeep materials and finishes
- · Use green and environment-friendly, non-toxic materials
- · Provide energy-efficient options (for example, solar)

Work approach

- · Comply with all Henrico County and HOA standards & rules
- · Avoid damage to existing structures
- Don't let animals out of yard (dogs and cats)
- · No injuries or mishaps during construction
- Compare and select deck and/or patio, and pool finishes; lighting; other stuff
- No rework

Examples of what we like and what we like about them

Design option 1 to replace current deck: Two-story deck

- Two story rectangular deck w/ second story as cover over first, except that we don't want stairs from second story; integrated with house; simple columns; built in lighting
- Will need to replace one existing window w/door to deck



Design option 2 to replace current deck: Covered single story deck

- · A-frame; height and openness of roof
- Simple columns
- · Integrated with deck and house



Deck replacement

Rectangular deck with wide, wrap-around steps down, built-in lighting; no railing or minimal







Pool


Love everything about this pool w/ integrated spa except a couple things. Love:

- Shape; free-form curves
- · Long, uniform shallow areas, tanning ledge, placement of deep end off far left
- Color of stone, coping, and patio

Don't want landscape areas close to the pool




Love the large tanning ledge w/ placement and size of stairs on the side

Bull nosed, safe non-slip (P4 or 5) Sealed marble or limestone maybe Something with a little iridescent fleck, subtle sparkle

Don't want

- · Brown, yellowish, or orange don't care for these
- · Dark grey, black too hot

Landscaping elements

Should be native to VA or proven to thrive in our climate (not sure if things below are suitable); we get mostly full sun in the backyard

 Flowers - bleeding hearts (must have!), bluebells, peony, lily, iris, daisies, bells of Ireland, flowers that smell good and look nice, chrysanthemums, forsythia, blue delphiniums, grape hyacinth, columbine



- Flowering bushes hydrangea, rose glow barberry shrub, gardenia, butterfly bush, azeleas, pink flowering almond
- · Privacy bushes please make recommendation
- · Climbing, flowering vines purple clematis, honey suckle,
- Trees Japanese maple, cherry blossom, fruit apples, cherries?, Blue Diddley Chaste Tree
- Bear grass

Undesirable items

- · Nothing poisonous to dogs, cats, or humans
- · Bamboo or other runners
- · High maintenance materials and finishes
- Large rocks as landscape elements
- Sharp edges
- · Slippery flooring & coping
